HISTORY OF THE STREETS PROPOSED TO BE VACATED:

The subject portion of N Lumber Street is in the 8th Ward. N Lumber Street has a 40.0 wide Right of Way and was opened and adopted by the City Ordinance Volume 1 Page 82 Section 5 on January 16, 1870.

The subject portion of N Refwal Street is in the 8th Ward. N Refwal Street has a 10.0 wide Right of Way and was created and located by the Joseph Balliet Subdivision dated January 1898 and recorded in the City Map File #174.

LOCATION AND CONDITION:

The subject portion of N Lumber Street is an opened dead end public street. There are existing public utility facilities within the subject right of way.

The subject portion of N Refwal Street is an unopened street. There are existing public utility facilities within the subject right of way.

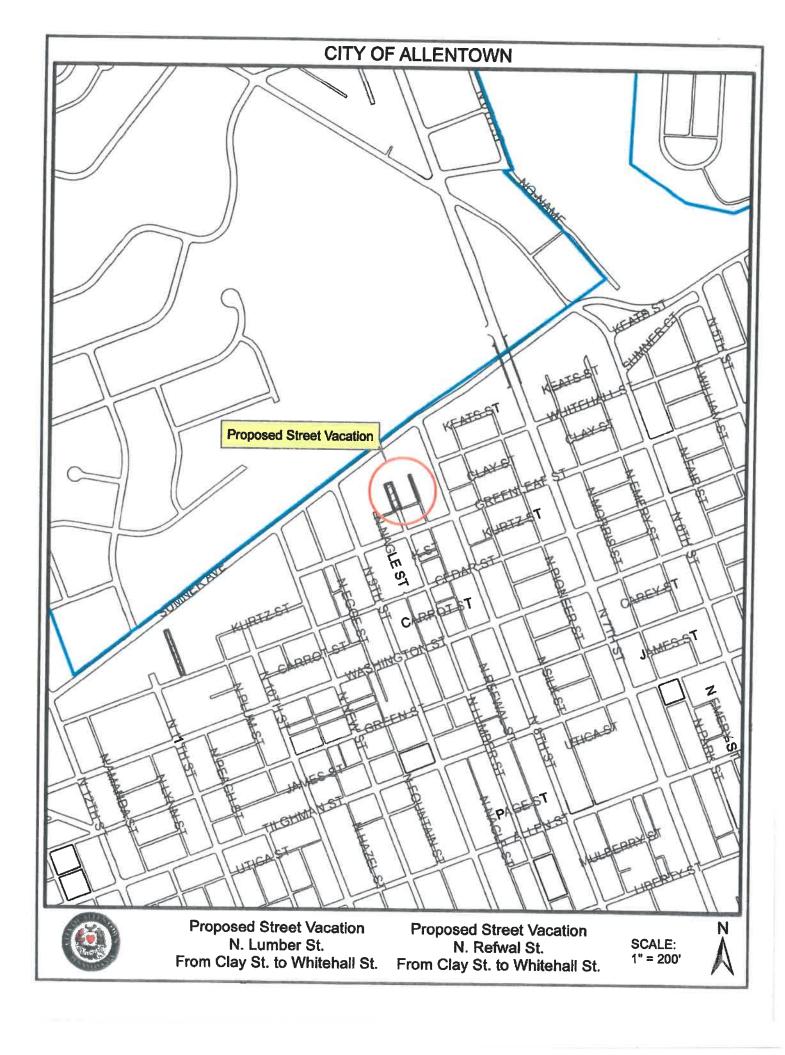

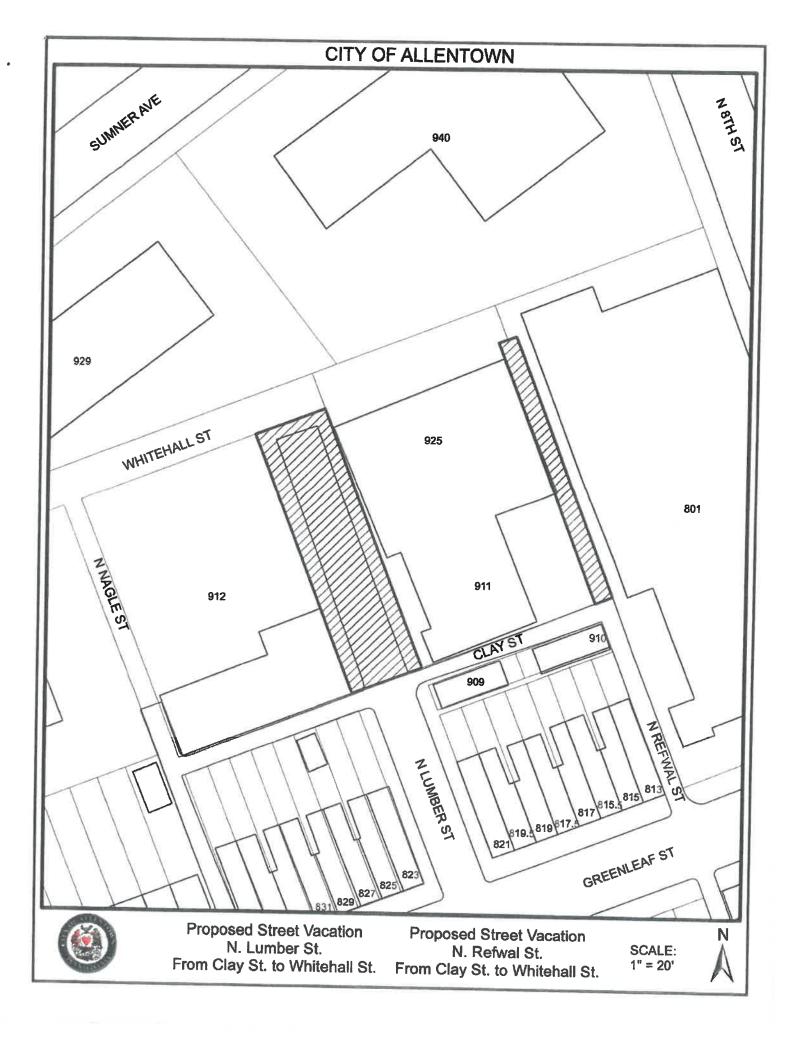
