Dear Mr. Jones,

This letter and approval for the attached Sewage Facilities Planning Module is based on the current estimate of available wastewater capacity. This letter does not promise, guarantee or assure any future conveyance or treatment allocation without compliance with all applicable rules and regulations, payment of all necessary fees and availability of the respective allocation at that time.

In accordance with the Interim Act 537 Plan submitted by the Kline's Island Sewer System (KISS) municipalities to the Pa. Department of Environmental Protection and approved on June 25, 2021, an amount equal to the property or development's wastewater flow will be allocated from the Connection Management Plan at the time of approval of the Sewage Facilities Planning Module. This property or development's wastewater flow need, as represented in the attached Sewage Planning Module, is 4,800 gallons per day. Therefore, the Connection Management Plan balance will be adjusted as follows:


#### **Project Description**

The project involves construction of a new 25,000 sf middle school building with related site improvements on the existing school campus at 1414 E. Cedar Street in the City of Allentown. The proposed building will add approximately 300 students, and 20 staff (teachers, and administrative personnel) to the existing population on campus. The proposed development will be served by connection to existing water and sewer lines of the Lehigh County Authority. Collection, conveyance and treatment of the project sewage will be provided by the Lehigh County Authority through existing facilities. The estimated 4,800 gpd additional flow (12 EDUs) is based upon 15 gpd/student or employee times a maximum of 320.

#### **Alternative Sewage Facilities Analysis**

The location of the site within the urban area of Allentown and the close proximity of existing public sewer and water lines in the surrounding streets dictates the methods for collection, conveyance, and treatment of the project's sewage and for provision of public water to the site.

There were no other alternatives analyzed for this project.










