AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2024 Grants Fund to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000.00) from the State Office of the Budget, Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP). These funds are a pass-through grant that will support the Da Vinci Science Center Downtown Allentown project.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the Grant Fund in the amount of Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000.00) from the State Office of the Budget as follows:

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SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation to the Grant Fund, 005-01-5201-0001-48 as follows:

SECTION THREE: That this Ordinance will take effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION FOUR: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

SECTION FIVE: Pursuant to Section 218 of the Home Rule Charter and by the affirmative vote of six of seven council members, Council hereby eliminates the fourteen-day period between introduction and passage of this ordinance.

Department of Community and Economic Development. This Bill is the result of the successful application and award of the RACP grant for Da Vinci Science Center.

The \$12,000,000 awarded in Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) funds will support the Da Vinci Science Center Downtown Allentown project.
