AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2021 Capital Fund Budget to provide for a transfer of Five-Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars and Eighty-Seven Cents (\$599.87) from Capital Project 2201 – Pool and Spray Parks to Capital Project 2206 – Jordan Creek Greenway Trail.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes a transfer within the 2021 Capital Fund in the amount of Five-Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars and Eighty-Seven Cents (\$599.87) in the following manner:

- **What Department or bureau is Bill originating from? Where did the initiative for the bill originate?**
Department of Parks and Recreation
- **Summary and Facts of the Bill**
Transfer funds from Project 2201, Pool and Spray Parks to Project 2202, Jordan Creek Greenway Trail (JCGT) in the amount of \$599.87 to be used for the construction of the Jordan Creek Greenway Trail.

 - **What does the Bill do – what are the specific goals/tasks the bill seek to accomplish**
Transferring the funds will help complete the construction of the Jordan Creek Greenway Trail. The awarded bid came in higher than originally anticipated so there is a shortfall in funds for this project.
 - **What are the Benefits of doing this/Down-side of doing this**
The City would like to complete this project and this transfer will help complete the JCGT project. The trail will be a significant connection of the city. PennDOT is contributing an additional \$486,272.40 to the project, this is for the remaining shortfall of funds.

Transferring the money will allow the City to complete the Jordan Creek Greenway Trail. The JCG Trail will be connecting Jordan Park to downtown Allentown.
