- What department or bureau is this bill originating from?

This bill originates from the Department of Community and Economic Development Grants Department on behalf of The Allentown Art Museum

- Summary and facts of the bill.

The City of Allentown is submitting a formal application to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) for \$1,000,000 awarded from the Statewide Local Share Account (LSA) grant that will support the construction and development of a new art museum at 10<sup>th</sup> and Hamilton Streets in center-city.

- a. What does the bill do? What are the specific goals or tasks the bill seeks to accomplish?

The Resolution is a requirement of the application to demonstrate the City's support for the project and to designate Mayor Matthew Tuerk as the signatory of the contract with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

- b. What are the benefits of doing this?

As the city's focal point of the arts, the new art museum will transform the downtown redevelopment of Allentown, increase tourism in the city as well as foot traffic to other center-city businesses and venues.

- c. How does this bill relate to the City's vision/mission/priorities?

Together with the conceptual and schematic phase of this project, the construction of a new museum will allow the Allentown Art Museum to better serve the community's needs, including the increasing demand for artistic and educational programs, while also increasing the organization's capacity, productivity, and efficiency.

The grant application is for \$1,000,000. All funding commitments are the responsibility of the Allentown Art Museum and there is no financial impact or risk to the City.

The project supports the City's priorities by increasing community development and resources available to Allentown residents, specifically low-to-moderate income individuals and families.
