AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2016 Health Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Eleven Thousand Two Hundred Forty (\$11,240) Dollars as a result of funds from the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PADOH) for the purchase of training and supplies for the Childhood Injury Prevention Program for the Safe and Healthy Homes initiative and mileage reimbursement. These funds will be used to train staff in the Safe and Healthy Homes project requirements and to purchase injury prevention supplies and asthma prevention supplies to be distributed during home assessments. These funds will be used to reimburse for mileage expense for home assessments.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2016 General Fund in the amount of Eleven Thousand Two Hundred Forty (\$11,240) Dollars reflecting monies received from PADOH to provide for injury prevention supplies, asthma prevention supplies, staff training and mileage reimbursement.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund to the Health Bureau as follows:

SECTION THREE: That this Ordinance will take effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION FOUR: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

- **What Department or bureau is Bill originating from? Where did the initiative for the bill originate?**

This Bill originated in Health upon receipt of funding for the Safe and Healthy Homes initiative.

- **Summary and Facts of the Bill**

Health wrote a grant which was awarded by PADOH. This grant is for Safe and Healthy Homes assessments to be conducted and injury and asthma prevention supplies to be distributed by staff trained in the Safe and Healthy Homes curriculum.

This Bill allows staff to be trained in the Safe and Healthy Homes curriculum. It allows for the city to be reimbursed for the mileage expense incurred for program work and for injury prevention and asthma prevention supplies to be given to those who have an assessment conducted.

There is no financial impact as we will purchase the supplies (pest traps, pest bait stations, metal mesh, caulk, caulk gun, bedbug interceptors, bed bug mattress covers, bed bug pillow covers, bed frame, HEPA vacuum cleaner, bucket, all-purpose cleaner, microfiber cloth, mop, trashcan with lid, and trash bags).

There is no financial impact as we will purchase the supplies to utilize the appropriation and more families will be served.
