AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance providing for the expenditure of Fifty-Three Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty-Nine (\$53,359.00) Dollars in Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG)- COVID CARES funds for the period of July 21, 2021 to July13, 2022, as appropriate by Federal Law and United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations for the Warming Station. The monies are by the City of Allentown under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1976, as amended; The Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of 2009; and Title II of the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended; for the purpose of undertaking programs of housing and community development within the City. This legislation is required to establish expenditure accounts for the City budgeting system, in addition to listing all the activities/programs which will be funded for the 2021 Consolidated Grants Program year.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That the Mayor is authorized to expend Fifty-Three Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty-Nine (\$53,359.00) Dollars in Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG)- COVID CARES funds for the period of July 21, 2021 to July13, 2022, as appropriate by Federal Law and United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations.

SECTION TWO: That the Mayor is directed to establish and maintain any and all accounts and records as are necessary and to make such transfers as may be required to expend and account for said ESG-CV Funds in accordance with the approved Consolidated Plan, appropriate Federal law, and HUD regulations.

SECTION THREE: That this act of the Council of the City of Allentown is undertaken pursuant to Act 292 of 1976 in accordance with the opinion of the Pennsylvania Attorney General (Opinion 72-76) which holds that CDBG, HOME, and ESG Funds are General Municipal Funds for the purpose of Act 292 of 1976.

SECTION FOUR: That, in accordance with the contract, the Council of the City of Allentown authorizes the appropriation of Fifty-Three Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty-nine (\$53,359.00) in the following manner:

SECTION FIVE: That this Ordinance will take effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION SIX: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

Under the provisions of the Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of 2009 (P.L. 111-22)(42 U.S.C.S. §11371 et. seq.)(the "Act"), which amended and reauthorized the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act of 1987 (P.L. 100-77); and in accordance with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development regulations at 24 CFR Parts 91 and 576; the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants to states and units of local governments.
