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AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2023 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of One Million Five Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight Dollars and Fifty-One Cents (\$1,574,858.51) from UGI for the purpose of constructing ADA handicap ramps and for the milling and paving of streets under the City's Utility Paving Program.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation of One Million Five Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight Dollars and Fifty-One Cents (\$1,574,858.51) to the following account:

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation One Million Five Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight Dollars and Fifty-One Cents (\$1,574,858.51) to the following accounts:

This bill would authorize the acceptance of \$1,574,858.51 from UGI that the City has negotiated for the purpose of construction of ADA handicap ramps and for the milling and paving of streets under the City's Utility Paving Program.

By collaborating with UGI through this Cost Share Program to pave the streets and replace the ADA handicap ramps, it will relieve homeowners of the financial burden.

This bill will allow the Department of Public Works to make road improvements on streets where UGI has completed gas main replacements.
