This letter and approval for the attached Sewage Facilities Planning Module is based on the current estimate of available wastewater capacity. This letter does not promise, guarantee or assure any future conveyance or treatment allocation without compliance with all applicable rules and regulations, payment of all necessary fees and availability of the respective allocation at that time.

In accordance with the Interim Act 537 Plan submitted by the Kline's Island Sewer System (KISS) municipalities to the Pa. Department of Environmental Protection and approved on June 25, 2021, an amount equal to the property or development's wastewater flow will be allocated from the Connection Management Plan at the time of approval of the Sewage Facilities Planning Module. This property or development's wastewater flow need, as represented in the attached Sewage Planning Module, is <u>476</u> gallons per day. The Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC) reviewed the above-referenced planning module according to the requirements of Act 537, the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act. We offer the following comments.

The LVPC reviewed a previous version of the planning module for this project on August 1, 2024 for a proposed 9,360 square foot, two-story expansion to the existing Allentown School District Building 21 High School for a family engagement and resource center on the north side of the 11.2-acre lot located at 265 Lehigh Street. The proposed expansion also included a new 20-space paved parking lot and associated sidewalks. The revised sewage facilities planning module is intended for a proposed 15,975 square foot, two-story expansion to the existing Allentown School District Building 21 High School for a family engagement and resource center on the north side of the 11.2-acre lot at 265 Lehigh Street. The proposed expansion includes a new 10-space paved parking lot and associated sidewalks. The development is proposed to be served by public sewage disposal. Wastewater generated from the development will be conveyed to the existing City wastewater collection system that already serves the high school, with ultimate treatment at the Kline's Island wastewater treatment plant. The revised sewage facilities planning module does not propose an increase to the proposed sewage flows for this project from the previous submission. The proposed sewage flows for this project are still 476 gallons per day (gpd). The provision of public sewage disposal aligns with the FutureLV: The Regional Plan actions to 'match development intensity with sustainable infrastructure capacity' (of Policy 1.1) and 'promote development in areas with public sewer and water capacity' (of Policy 3.2).



#### **Project Narrative:**

The Allentown School District Welcome Center site consists of one 11.2-acre lot containing one existing high school building. The site is located at 265 Lehigh Street in the City of Allentown, Lehigh County.

The project consists of a 15,975 SF, two-story addition to the existing Building 21 High School which will serve as a Family Engagement and Resource Center. The project will utilize the existing water connection and proposes a new connection to the existing sanitary service lateral to the Lehigh County Authority (LCA) collection system.

The proposed project will increase the sanitary sewage flows by approximately 476 GPD. This increase is based on a design capacity of approximately 60 people per day at 7 GPD/occupant which gives an approximate usage of 420 GPD which was rounded up to be 2 City of Allentown/LCA EDUs or 476 GPD. This is equivalent to approximately 1.19 PADEP EDUs.



#### Alternate Sewer Facilities Analysis:

The project site is proposing to connect to the sanitary service line from the existing high school building to the existing City of Allentown - Lehigh County Authority (LCA) collection and conveyance system, into the LCA sewer system, and finally the Kline's Island wastewater treatment plant.
