AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2021 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars from Stonyfield Organic for the purchase of Foamstream Equipment as part of the Non-Toxic Neighborhoods Initiative.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2021 General Fund in the amount of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars reflecting receipt of monies from Stonyfield Organic:
