This Bill is being initiated by the Department of Public Works.

Summary and Facts of the Bill

Beginning on January 22, 2016 the City experienced a snow storm which resulted in 31.9" of snow by the time the storm ended on January 23, 2016. This record breaking snow event resulted in the need for the City to hire contractors to assist with snow removal. These unexpected expenses totaled \$533,131.54.

As a result of the unexpected 31.9" of snow that arrived between January 22nd and January 23rd the City needed to hire contractors to help with snow removal. The list these contractors are hired from is developed through a Quote done by Purchasing to find out what companies have the equipment and manpower needed in this type of situation.

The City is submitting a request to PEMA for reimbursement in the amount of \$634,372.72 which, if approved, will go back into the unappropriated balance of both the General Fund and Liquid Fuels Funds respectively.

This is a one-time cost that was needed to maintain the public's safety following a record breaking snow storm.
