AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2021 Capital Fund Budget to provide for a transfer of Fourteen Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Four Dollars (\$14,694) as a transfer of funds from Capital Project 2024 – 15th Street Traffic Signal Improvements to Capital Project 2202 – Jordan Creek Greenway Trail to provide pavement markings on the Meadow Street portion of the trail.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That the City Council authorizes a transfer in the amount of Fourteen Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Four Dollars (\$14,694) from Capital Project 2024 to Capital Project 1663 as follows:
