### **Contract Approval**

RESOLUTIONS FOR FINAL PASSAGE (To be Voted On):

#### **R58**

Authorizes Change Order Number 3 for \$19,850.00 with Synergy Environmental, Inc., to deepen site monitoring wells where underground storage tanks have been removed to comply with the PaDEP, the original cost of the project was for \$24,590; the change orders have been for \$4,000(1); \$2,850(2); \$19,850(3) for a new total of \$51, 290.

#### Info:

Where was underground tank removed? There were two (2) underground fuel storage tanks removed at the Streets Department facility. These tanks had expended their useful life and were replaced by two (2) new above ground fuel storage tanks. The replacement of the two underground storage tanks with new tanks was a required condition of the lease of the Streets facility from the Airport Authority (LNAA).

Is this a result of following mandates as we go along? Yes, PADEP requires that when underground fuel storage tanks are decommissioned that they must be removed. When they are removed PADEP requires the soil and water in the tank excavation pit to be tested to determine if any pollutants are present and if found to remove and remediate the soil and monitor groundwater at the site to ensure no pollutants migrate offsite. This is a necessary part of the process toward the final Closeout Approval to be issued by PADEP.

Is this reimbursable? Yes. The purchase of any fuel oil product in PA includes a percentage of the purchase price to be allocated for an Underground Storage Tank Indemnification Fund (USTIF). The fund is essentially an insurance fund that is used to reimburse entities that must perform the cleanup and / or monitoring of an underground storage tank site.

Was this originally bid and did Council approve it? If so, what was the background of the bid – multiple bids? Yes. This contract was a bid contract that Council did approve. There were originally four (4) quotations received. Synergy Environmental, Inc. was the selected qualified low bidder for the project.

#### **R59**

Authorization for Engagement of Professional Services with Scott Grim for the hourly rate of \$25.00 not to exceed \$12,000 in the initial contract to work with the Opiod death review team doing administrative tasks inclusive of data analysis, death reviews, coordinating meetings with law enforcement reporting PHAST accomplishments to grantors; gnerally supporting the work of the Opioid death review team performing duties as assigned.

#### R60

Authorization for Engagement of Professional Services with Miron Technologies, Inc., in the amount of \$2,200.00. Scope of services include quarterly provision of 6 or more radiation monitoring badges and one control badge for use by Health Bureau Sanitarians performing lead paint inspections for child lead poisoning investigations. The lead paint analyzer utilizes a radioactive source and monitoring badges are federally mandated for each user. The service also includes analysis of the badges for radiation exposure and data maintenance of each user's exposure history as well as web-based report generation to meet supervisory requirements.
