

CITY OF ALLENTOWN

No. 154 RESOLUTION R - 2022

Introduced by the Administration on October 5, 2022

Approves the Submission of an amendment to the 2021 Action Plan to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Resolved by the Council of the City of Allentown, That

WHEREAS, the City of Allentown is eligible to apply for funding through federal housing and community development programs for use within the City; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development requires the City to prepare an Action Plan to receive such funding; and

WHEREAS, the Action Plan serves as the application for Community Development Block Grant Program, HOME Investment Partnerships Program and Emergency Solutions Grants Program funds, and describes how the City plans to use the federal funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Allentown hereby approves of the submission to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development of the amendment to the Action Plan for the period January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021.

The attached legislation, from the Department of Community and Economic Development serves as the template for the City of Allentown's request to allocate unspent funds from the federal HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) in the amount of \$160,000.00 and \$150,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). This piece of legislation serves a specific purpose, which contains all the recommended regulatory steps needed to apply for federal funds.

With the application to HUD, the City is asking to allocate unspent funds to a Habitat for Humanity - Tacoma Street (\$160,000 HOME Funds) and Hazard Eliminaton and Jordan Greenway totaling (\$150,000 CDBG Funds) also to achieve Community and Economic Development goals, as described in the Five Year Consolidated Plan for the use of federal funds.
