AN ACT

Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in preemptions, providing for regulation of firearms and ammunition. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. The General Assembly finds that: (1) It is proper for law-abiding people to protect themselves, their families and others from intruders and 8 attackers without fear of prosecution or civil action for 9 10 acting in defense of themselves and others.

- (2) Section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of
 Pennsylvania guarantees that the "right of the citizens to
 bear arms in defense of themselves and the State shall not be
 questioned."
- 15 (3) Commonwealth law currently limits regulation of
 16 firearms, ammunition and ammunition components by political
 17 subdivisions in order to further the right guaranteed by
 18 section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

- (4) Unlawful regulation of firearms, ammunition and ammunition components by political subdivisions and the threat of citation, prosecution or other legal process posed by such regulation interfere with this right.

 (5) Such interference with the right guaranteed by section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of Pennsylvania
 - section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of Pennsylvania unduly inhibits law-abiding people from protecting themselves, their families and others from intruders and attackers and from other legitimate uses of constitutionally protected arms, including hunting and sporting activities.

- 13 § 305. Regulation of firearms and ammunition.
- 14 (a) General rule. -- The provisions of section 2962(g)
