Introduced by the Administration on December 7, 2016

Authorizes Submission of an Application to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation's Multimodal Transportation Fund for a Grant of Nine Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand Six Hundred Ten Dollars and Fifteen Cents (\$967,610.15) for Use in the Traffic Calming and Safety Improvements Along the South Jefferson Street Corridor Project

Resolved by the Council of the City of Allentown, That

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Allentown, Lehigh County hereby requests a Multimodal Transportation Fund grant of \$967,610.15 from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation to partially defray the cost of the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Allentown hereby designates Ed Pawlowski, Mayor, and Brent Hartzell, Finance Director, as the official(s) to execute all documents and agreements between the City of Allentown and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation to facilitate and assist in obtaining the requested grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Allentown, hereby authorizes the City of Allentown to submit the application for Nine Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand Six Hundred Ten Dollars and Fifteen Cents (\$967,610.15) in Multimodal Transportation Funding to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

Grant application to be submitted to PennDOT's Multimodal Transportation Fund for traffic calming and safety improvements along the South Jefferson Street corridor between Elm and Lehigh Streets.

The bill formally requests the grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Multimodal Transportation Fund, authorizes the Mayor to execute all documents, and identifies the amount of the grant of a \$967,610.15 request. The City cannot apply without this resolution.

The cost of the project is approximately \$1,257,893.20 for Design, construction, inspection and materials.

The City's match of \$290,283.05 will come from City Capital Funds.

PennDOT's 15th Street project including paving and signal upgrades will be completed BY 2018. It is anticipated that there will be a substantial increase in vehicular and pedestrian usage. In addition to traffic calming features, a bike-share lane to promote access to Hamilton Street is also planned. This project will also address the lack of adequate street light illumination on this stretch of the project from Elm to Wyoming. In addition, the City will be keeping pace with it's commitment to improve handicap ramps throughout the city. This project is vital for the safety of motorists and pedestrian.
