

The City of Allentown is working with LANTA on a land swap at Bicentennial Park. LANTA is currently planning to redevelop a portion of their site, allowing for new fueling and maintenance areas. At the same time, the City has asked LANTA to realign the western boundary between Bicentennial Park and the LANTA site to closer align with the current and future development of the site. The relocation of the property line will ensure that the property line does not cross the left outfield sideline fence and into the outfield, that LANTA will be able to continue to develop their site, and will allow for additional parking on the property occupied by Bicentennial Park.
