Mr. Ray O'Connell stated that Mr. Heffentrager is right. The city has a

contract with Granicus and we have been encouraging everyone to use it. He asked Mr. Hartzell to check on it. Everyone should be using it.

Mr. Daryl Hendricks stated that Council notified IT.

Mr. Glenn Hunsicker, 844 S. 11th Street, asked about 2013 Budget. He stated that back in 2013, it was about \$89 - \$90 million. What is the root cause of it going up every year. He asked Mr. Hartzell to emphasize the amount of money that the city took in bonds since 2010. He asked Mr. Glazier about the General City charges, especially the formula for the Golf Course.

Mr. Julio Guridy stated about \$99 million. He stated usually health benefit costs, plus wages.

Mr. Brent Hartzell stated that he doesn't want to impose on Mr. Hunsicker time. The cost drivers are personnel related, MMO at \$3.1 million and an increase in health insurance cost with another \$1 million per year. The city has done a remarkable job in constraining the cost. He asked what type of income, household income that contributed to it or tax revenues.

Mr. Ray O'Connell stated that we all totally agree.

Mr. Robert Trotner stated that he is here for the Community Action Reform Team Critical Committee. He asked if the Budget will be posted on the website. He asked for a timeframe.

Mr. Brent Hartzell stated that it is common practice that we get the paper budget in its final form before we put it online. Once the book is printed and distributed, it will be online. He stated sometime in early January.

Mr. George Schaller, 622 1/2 Park Street, talked about overflow in the wastewater and stormwater system.

Dr. David McGuire stated that the sewage treatment problem involves the City of Allentown and the other signatories. They gather only sewage to their intake that goes to the Allentown treatment plant. When it rains, additional water flows into the sewage treatment plant because defects of the piping system.
