AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2017 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Office of The State Fire Commissioner Grant, to the Allentown Fire Department to provide for new Thermal Imager Equipment.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2017 General Fund in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) reflecting receipt of monies from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Office of The State Fire Commissioner grant to purchase Thermal Imager Equipment.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund to the Fire Department budget as follows:

## Fire Department Fire Suppression/Extinguishment

000-05-0803-0002-72 Equipment

\$ 15,000.00

SECTION THREE: That this Ordinance will take effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION FOUR: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

Summary and Facts of the Bill

The Allentown Fire Department was awarded a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Office Of The State Fire Commissioner grant to purchase Fire Training Equipment.

The Bill will provide funding for the purchase of Fire Thermal Imaging equipment to be used by the Allentown Fire Department personnel. Thermal Imager Equipment technology is a vital element in most emergency situations. Failure to have functional, proper and adequate equipment may result in injury or death to our first responders and civilians.
