AN ORDINANCE

An ordinance of the City Council of the City of Allentown, Pennsylvania, amending Part Seven (General Offenses Code), Article 730 of the Codified Ordinances by adding section 730.99.1 to establish guidelines for police officers to follow when effectuating warrantless arrests when the conduct constitutes a summary offense pursuant to Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial procedure), Part viii (Criminal Proceedings), Chapter 89 (commencement of proceedings), Subchapter a (general provisions) of the Pennsylvania consolidated statutes.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Title 42, Chapter 89, Subchapter A (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure), of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, 42 Pa.C.S.A § 8902(a), for any of the following offenses, a police officer shall, upon view, have the right of arrest without a warrant upon probable cause when there is ongoing conduct that imperils the personal security of any person or endangers public or private property under Title 18 (relating to crimes and offenses) when each offense constitutes a summary offense:

18 Pa. C.S.A § 5503 (relating to disorderly conduct)

18 Pa. C.S.A. § 5505 (relating to public drunkenness)

18 Pa. C.S.A. § 5507 (relating to obstructing highways and other public passages)

18 Pa. C.S.A. § 6308 (relating to purchase, consumption, possession or transportation of liquor or malt or brewed beverages).

WHEREAS, The City Council desires to formalize written guidelines for police officers to follow when making a warrantless arrest under 42 Pa.C.S.A § 8902(b).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 730 of the Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to add Section 730.99.1 as follows:

Section 730.99.1. Guidelines for Police Officers in Making Certain Warrantless Arrests

A. A police officer is authorized to make an arrest without a warrant when the officer observes conduct constituting a summary offense as set forth herein and in 42 Pa.C.S.A § 8902(a), as may be

amended, and such conduct imperils the personal security of any person or endangers public or private property.

B. Arrests authorized under this Section 730.99.1 shall proceed in accordance with Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure 440 and 441, as may be amended.

C. This Section 730.99.1 shall not modify, restrict or otherwise prohibit a police officer from making any other warrantless arrests or arrests for summary offenses where such arrests have otherwise expressly been authorized by any other statute.

Section 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. If any section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance, which provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be effective in ten (10) days from the date of adoption.
