2017 Parks Accomplishments

Completed Stevens Park renovation;

Completed full restoration of West Park fountain and restored brick base of the park's Ignatz Gresser monument;

Installed new picnic pavilions at the Rose Garden and Jordan Park;

Began building the City's first off-leash dog park;

Began converting park lighting and park buildings to LED lighting;

2018 Parks Goals

Focus on park maintenance and infrastructure;

Continue to reduce energy costs by converting to LED lights wherever feasible;

Continue tree work throughout the park system;

Complete accessibility upgrades to Cedar Poolhouse.

In addition to completing design and construction documents for the Jordan Park skatepark and the Jordan Creek Greenway Trail;

- Complete Auburn Cross Trails Master Plan;
- Complete park master plans for Valania and Irving-Andre Reed Parks;

2017 Recreation Accomplishments

Basketball league participation continued to increase:

Summer basketball league participation up to 52 Boys teams and 28 Girls teams;

Increased collaboration with high school coaches from Allen, Dieruff and Lincoln Leadership;

Winter basketball league participation up to 32 Boys teams;

2017 Recreation Accomplishments

Revenue producing Learn to Swim program reached capacity;

Partnered with Allentown Police Department to conduct inaugural Fitness Challenge at 18 playground sites;

Doubled number of Lively Lunches in the Park performances and introduced new Saturday in the Park series featuring local bands;

Re-introduced Lights in the Parkway, with payment available via credit cards- generated \$197,223 in revenue- highest amount on record;

2018 Recreation Goals

Conduct Coach / Parent clinics to lay the groundwork to improve the City's youth sports opportunities;

Increase sponsorships for programs and special events;

Improve program and special event marketing;

Generate additional revenue through a variety of Aquatic programming opportunities.

2017 Special Events Accomplishments

Coordinated and ran 94 city events and concerts;

Managed permitting of approximately 210 non-City special events and block parties;

 Assisted with coordination and provided support to 25 city-sponsored events with partner organizations;

Increased event revenue by \$3,000 so far in 2017; anticipate another \$1,500 in revenue prior to December 31.

2018 Special Event Goals

- Examine fee schedule and establish policies to ensure that the fees charged are consistent with the size and impact of the event, and comparable with cities of similar size;
- Conduct outreach workshops in the community to explain block party and event planning process;
- Increase event revenue by following up promptly and setting deadlines with events;

2017 Golf Course Accomplishments

Replaced and upgraded golf cart fleet;

Replaced irrigation pump and installed new software;

Constructed new maintenance building to protect irrigation pump and to add storage;

Removed 80+ trees from the course to achieve better quality turf at tees and greens by improving sunlight and air circulation;

2017 Golf Course Accomplishments

Began the process to secure Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Golf Program Certification;

Focus on enhancing the valuable natural areas and wildlife habitats that golf courses provide, improves efficiency, and minimizes potentially harmful impacts of golf course operations;

Added more native areas to reduce maintenance costs and chemical usage;

Installed new lighting near clubhouse and parking lot;

2018 Golf Course Goals

Improve marketing by better utilizing AMGC website and app to introduce juniors, women and men to the game;

Continue to improve upon reducing water usage and turf quality via new software and ongoing irrigation improvements;

Continue turf quality improvements through ongoing tree management program;

2017 Parks & Recreation Department Challenges

- Cedar Beach Pool delays;
- Use of parks reaching a critical point in terms of increased conflicts involving park users that require Police;
- Continued growth of non-City sponsored special events monopolizing staff time;
- Wet, rainy summer impacted rounds played at golf course and resulted in numerous cancelled / postponed movies and concerts;
