AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2017 E-911 Fund Budget by transferring One Million (\$1,000,000) Dollars from the unappropriated balance of the E-911 Fund for the down payment on the radio system upgrade. The 2017 financial impact is the \$1,000,000 down payment to Harris. PEMA is allowing the use of \$1,200,000 of 911 funds toward the purchase of this equipment. One Million (\$1,000,000) Dollars will be used as the down payment to the vendor, Harris, and the remaining \$200,000 will be paid in 2018 toward the debt service of the loan. Starting in 2019 there will be an annual payment of \$535,308 divided among the 4 funds that use the radio system for the next 5 years.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes a transfer from the unappropriated balance of the E-911 Fund in the amount of One Million (\$1,000,000) Dollars in the following manner:

SECTION TWO: That this Ordinance will take effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION THREE: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

- **Summary and Facts of the Bill**

Due to the aging radio system the City currently uses and the need to better communicate with other emergency services in this region, it has become necessary to completely upgrade the current radio system. PEMA is allowing the City to use \$1,200,000 of 911 funds toward the purchase of this equipment. \$1,000,000 will be used as the down payment to the vendor, Harris, and the remaining \$200,000 will be paid in 2018 toward the debt service of the loan.
