AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2018 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars. This was a result of a mitigation fee contribution from City Center toward the cost of a study to survey the historic buildings along Hamilton Street from American Parkway to 12th Street as required by the Zoning Hearing Board.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2018 General Fund in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars reflecting receipt of monies for a mitigation fee contribution from City Center toward the cost of a study to survey the historic buildings along Hamilton Street from American Parkway to 12th Street as required by the Zoning Hearing Board.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund as follows:

SECTION THREE: That this Ordinance will take effect ten (10) days after final passage.

SECTION FOUR: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

Summary and Facts of the Bill

This is a request for a resolution to accept a mitigation fee in the amount of \$25,000 from City Center for the demolition of historic buildings at 736 to 744 Hamilton Street.

The bill allows the City to accept the \$25,000 mitigation fee which is a condition of the zoning approval to demolish the buildings as determined by the Zoning Hearing Board (See the attached zoning decision) and agreed upon by City Center. The buildings were in the Historic Building Demolition Overlay Zone which makes demolition of a building a Special Exception. The Historical Architectural Review Board gets the opportunity to comment on the demolition and they recommended the fee and other mitigation requirements be fulfilled prior to demolition (See the attached HARB decision). This payment will be used by the City, to fund, in whole or in part, a study by a qualified historic preservation consultant of the buildings along Hamilton Street from American Parkway to 12th Street. The study will determine the historic and architectural significance of buildings along Hamilton Street and prioritize the buildings for additional protections under the Zoning Ordinance. The City's Comprehensive Plan recommends preservation and reuse of historic buildings. The City is recognized by the National Park Service and the PA State Historic Preservation Office as Certified Local Government for its historic preservation program.
