### AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2018 Solid Waste Fund Budget by transferring One Hundred Thirty-Seven Thousand Seven Hundred (\$137,700) Dollars from the unappropriated balance to cover unbudgeted expenses in 2018. Funds are available due to unexpected receipt of funds from the Allentown Parking Authority for street cleaning services.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2018 Solid Waste Fund in the amount of One Hundred Thirty-Seven Thousand Seven Hundred (\$137,700) Dollars from the receipt of funds from the Allentown Parking Authority.

SECTION TWO: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the 2018 Solid Waste Fund in the following manner:

This Bill appropriates \$137,700 from the unappropriated balance of the Solid Waste Fund due to receipt of funds from the Allentown Parking Authority for street cleaning services.

The remaining \$53,570.44 will be used to pay the recycling vendor because of the low return currently being received on recyclable material.
