About the State Ethics Commission

The first Pennsylvania Public Official and Employee Ethics Act, Act 170 (1978, 65 P.S. §401, et seq., primarily became effective January 1, 197 The Act was amended and reenacted in 1989 by Act 9 of 1989 and in 1984 Act 93 of 1998. (See Act 9 of 1989, 65 P.S. §401, et seq. and Act 93 of Chapter 11, 65 Pa.c.s. §1101 et seq.) The Act provides that public office public trust and that any effort to realize personal financial gain through public office is a violation of that trust. The Act was passed to strength faith and confidence of the people of the Commonwealth in their government. The Act established the State Ethics Commission to admit and enforce the provisions of the Act and to provide guidance regarding standards established by the Act.

POWERS AND DUTIES

- Rendering prospective advisory opinions to present or former pub officials and public employees, or their appointing authorities or employers, regarding such individuals' duties and responsibilities the Ethics Act.
- Prescribing Financial Interests Statement forms for filing; receivin reviewing statements of persons required to file; inspecting a suc statements to ascertain whether any reporting person has failed t such statement or has filed a deficient statement.
- Accepting and filing information voluntarily supplied that exceeds requirements of the law.
- Preserving statements and reports filed with the Commission for a period of five years. Maintaining a master index of statements fil with the Commission and making statements available for public inspection and copying.
- Instructing other state and local agencies in the maintenance of systems which facilitate public access to such statements.
- Investigating alleged violations of the Ethics Act and issuing decis relation to said investigations. Holding hearings, taking testimon issuing subpoenas, and compelling the attendance of witnesses.
- Preparing and publishing an annual report, special reports, educa materials, and technical studies to further the purposes of the Act
- Prescribing rules and regulations to implement the provisions of t Ethics Act.
- Holding at least two public hearings each year to seek input from persons and organizations which represent individuals subject to Ethics Act.
