SUBJECT: Nomination for Vice President of Council

You also know I have been in City Council for the past 18 years which makes me the longest serving elected official in the City. I have been Vice President 6 years and President 3 years. I have been reelected more times to the City Council than any member in recent history. This gives me much experience in our City Government when considering the diverse population of Allentown.

In fact, as Vice President and as President, I have presided over some of the most strenuous and memorable meetings in the past 2 decades of City Council, which included the misfortune of having to terminate a police officer.
