- 2. West End Youth Organization play in the South Parkland League (Kempton). 86 teams in the league and have 3 divisions T-Ball, Midget, Knee-Hi 1 sometimes 2 at every level up to age 14. (10 players on each team).

- 3. Allentown A's play an in-house league for T-Ball (ages 3, 4, & 5)
- Mountainville Memorial Little League play in-house Little League and offer T-Ball up to 13/14 year olds. Offer baseball in fall/spring and have 2 teams at every level.
