AN ORDINANCE

Amending the Zoning Map of the City of Allentown by rezoning parcels:

640649229609 and 640639668593 (the former City Incinerator Site)

from BL-I Business Light Industrial to I-3 General Industrial

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That the area on the Zoning Map of the City of Allentown, depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, be rezoned from BL-I Business Light Insdustrial to I-3 General Industrial.

SECTION TWO: That all Ordinances inconsistent with the above provisions are repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.
