AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2019 Risk Fund Budget by transferring One Million Five Hundred Thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars from the unappropriated balance of the Risk Fund for Employee Health Benefits.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from the unappropriated balance of the 2019 Risk Fund in the amount of One Million Five Hundred Thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars in the following manner:

This Bill allows for the transfers funds from the unappropriated balance of the Risk Fund for health insurance in an effort to maintain the account in a positive status.

The first half of this year is seeing a slight continuation of higher than usual monthly insurance costs as was experienced at the end of 2018.
