AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2019 General Fund Budget to provide for a supplemental appropriation of Fifty-Seven Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Eight (\$57,398) Dollars from the Pennsylvania Department of Justice grant to the City of Allentown for the purchase of InTime scheduling software (\$39,420) and Lehigh County's portion to purchase a drone to document crime scenes and accidents from an aerial point of view (\$17,987).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2019 General Fund in the amount of Fifty-Seven Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-Eight (\$57,398) Dollars reflecting receipt of monies from the Pennsylvania Department of Justice Grant.

This bill reflects a Department of Justice Grant 2017-DJ-BX-0584 for \$ 57,398 for the Allentown Police Department (\$39,420.00) and Lehigh County Regional Crime Center (\$17,978.00). The funds are to be used for the purchase of InTime scheduling software to be utilized by the entire department and the County portion to purchase a drone to document crime scenes and accidents from an aerial point of view.
