#### RESOLUTION

## Introduced by City Council and the Administration on June 17, 2020

## Recognizing Juneteenth Freedom Day as a Day of Remembrance

#### Resolved by the Council of the City of Allentown, That

**WHEREAS**, **Juneteenth** is the oldest known celebration commemorating the abolition of slavery in the United States and the emancipation of African American slaves throughout the Confederate south; and

**WHEREAS**, the Emancipation Proclamation, issued on January 1, 1863, came to fruition in the entire south, two years later on June 19, 1865 when Union soldiers landed in Galveston; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth marked the end of slavery in the United States and is celebrated to this day as a way to unite the community; and

**WHEREAS**, **Juneteenth** commemorates African-American freedom and the common mission of promoting and cultivating knowledge and appreciation of the African American story – the history, resilience and struggle in helping to make this country live up to its ideals.

**NOW, THEREFORE ALLENTOWN CITY COUNCIL** and the Administration recognizes **Juneteenth** and the continuing journey and struggle for freedom and equality in America.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLIVED THAT** Council and the Administration recommend the state and county set this day as a special holiday for state observance.
