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#### AN ORDINANCE

Amending the 2020 General Fund, Risk Management Fund, Trexler Fund, Solid Waste Fund, Golf Fund and Equipment Fund Budgets to provide for a supplemental appropriation totaling One Million Nine Hundred Ninety-Two Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-Two Dollars and Three Cents (\$1,992,372.03) from the County of Lehigh as part of disbursement of funds through the COVID-19 County Relief Block Grant Program.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That City Council authorizes an increase to the unappropriated balance of the 2020 General Fund, Risk Management Fund, Trexler Fund, Solid Waste Fund, Golf Fund and Equipment Fund in the following manner:

Governor Tom Wolf has approved the disbursement of funds through the COVID-19 County Relief Block Grant Program/June 2020. The City of Allentown's Department of Community and Economic Development has sent the required narrative requesting consideration of the possible allocation of the funds for the benefit of all City of Allenown Departments.

Lehigh County has been awarded State Grant Funds to be allocated throughout the County to help alleviate the financial burden of the COVID 19 Pandemic. The City of Allentown could be awarded \$1,992,372.03 of those funds which have been based on the city's population.
