PARKS BUREAU – TYPICAL MAINTENANCE RESPONSIBILITIES

- 36 public parks & playgrounds (2,000+ acres of park land/35+ miles of trails)
- 4 swimming pools/2 spray parks
- 1 golf course
- 1 dog park
- 1 stadium – Earl F. Hunsicker Stadium at Bicentennial Park
- 1 trout nursery
- 1 roller hockey rink
- 1 skate park
- 8 volleyball courts
- 10 handball courts
- 11 tennis courts
- 21 baseball fields
- 22 basketball courts
- Snow removal of park paths & 115 miles of Allentown west end streets
- Tree removals in public right-of-way as needed
- Dam maintenance for minimum 4 dams
- Several historic structures
- Lights in the Parkway set-up/removal

PARKS MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES UNDER COVID-19

With exponential increase of park visitors came significant increase in litter

- Only 4 “critical” maintenance employees maintained parks & trails for 2 weeks

With spring weather rapidly approaching & mindful of COVID restrictions

- April 1 – COVID plan developed to gradually & safely return all maintenance employees
- April 6 - 17 employees returned to work
- April 20 - all 40 maintenance employees were fully-engaged
- Regular maintenance operations functioned daily
- Caution tape replaced almost daily around playground equipment
- Additional COVID signage placed/replaced weekly

Seasonal Hires

Anticipating “Green” phase in summer

- 2 Pools made ready to potentially open July 4 weekend
- Sports fields periodically maintained



PARKS MAINTENANCE 2020 SUCCESSES

- Conducted daily maintenance activities in a manner to mitigate employee COVID-19 exposure risk and ensure safety of both employees and the public
- Conducted daily maintenance and regular sanitization of all public restrooms with running water (other restrooms remained closed)
- Regularly removed sports equipment placed on city sports fields by the public to deter organized sports activities during mandated “shut down”
- Completed following improvements
 - West Park bandshell
 - WPA projects
 - Lehigh Parkway wall – Phase 1
 - Junction Street
 - Mack Pool repairs, painting, electrical work
 - Lehigh Parkway “Fly Shop” – new roof
 - Dog Park at Dixon Street – replaced gate control system
 - Andre Reed Park & Roosevelt Park - installed pickle ball courts



PARKS MAINTENANCE 2020 SUCCESSES (cont'd)

- Lehigh Parkway - completed milemarker project in collaboration with Lehigh Valley Roadrunners
- Trexler Park - extensive invasive tree removal/native tree replacement
- Addressed following issues resulting from Tropical Storm Isaias
 - Extensive tree removals in parks and streets/public right-of-way
- Cedar Creek Parkway
 - Park pathways - redressed
 - Asphalt repairs made
 - Cedar Pool - drained and cleaned due to flooding
- Jordan Meadows
 - Extensive removal of vegetation
 - Irrigation repairs to the football field
- Jordan Park & Trout Creek Parkway
 - Park pathways – redressed
- Lehigh Parkway – pathways reconstructed



RECREATION BUREAU - TYPICAL ANNUAL ACTIVITIES

- Basketball – year-round & Queen of the Court (middle school)
- Volleyball – winter & summer
- Baseball – spring into fall
- Aquatics – year-round programs
- Summer Playground Program (8-weeks)
- Soccer
- Pickleball
- Summer Concert series, Saturday in the Park
- Special events
 - Romper Day
 - Fishing in the Park
 - Cedar Sports Day



RECREATION BUREAU ACTIVITIES UNDER COVID-19

Timeline

- March 16 – COVID restrictions in place at Parks/Rec office
- March 23 – all recreational activities cancelled
- March 30 - all office employees working from home
- April 20 – all office employees furloughed (excluding Rhoads & El-Chaar)
- June 15 – all furloughed personnel returned to full-time work with in-office presence; office opened to public with COVID restrictions
- Mid-July to early-August sports field rentals allowed, then shut down; pavilion rentals with COVID restrictions continued through end-October



RECREATION BUREAU 2020 SUCCESSES

Due to inability of offering in-person recreational programs in addition to the recent announcement of ASD education remaining on-line through January 31, 2021, Rec staff created virtual programs to do at home or in a park

- Water Safety Wednesdays available mid-July onwards
- Queen of the Court – annual fall offering for middle school girls – basketball coach demonstrating skills/drills and guest speakers presenting life skills
- Mindful Mondays – relaxation, breathing & de-stressing techniques
- 5-day fitness programs – easy fitness activities for elementary-age children
- Soccer Saturday – soccer basics for elementary-age children
- Learn to Swim at Home – swim coach presents basic techniques for children and their caregivers
- DIY recreation activities

Introduction of MyRec software – web-based recreation facility management and registration software which provides for on-line payments and reservations at the convenience of the public.



MyRec Recreation Management Software

- Contactless POS system for online registrations, reservations and payments (credit/debit cards)
- Household/Family user accounts for ease of use
- Paperless program management (forms/contacts/scheduling)
- Single management system for recreation/aquatics/concessions
- Online POS store capabilities
- Membership capabilities with photos
- Easy to access library of information about Parks and Recreation
- Overall improved customer service and streamlined operations





ALLENTOWN MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE ACTIVITIES UNDER COVID-19

- March 17 – April 30 Golf Course closed
- May 1 – Course reopened following CDC and Governor Wolf guidelines, reviewed by Vicky Kistler and Jeffrey Nelson
 - Point of sale contact – payment by credit card only
 - Scheduled separate riding and walking tee times
 - Sanitized golf carts after each use
 - Controlled social distancing of golfers at driving range
- Implemented programs to reduce mowing frequency, applied additional top-dressing and growth regulators
- Closing of the course to the public provided time to improve course turf quality



KEY 2020 ALLENTOWN MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE SUCCESSES

- \$1.43 million in revenue (through October 31)
- Generated \$250,000 in driving range revenue; 45% ahead of 2020 projection
- Anticipate more than 40,000 rounds of golf for 2020 season
- Over 60 trees planted on the course in fall 2020
- *Turfgrass Disease Solutions* favorable report on course conditions
- Addressed issues caused by Tropical Storm Isaias and saved 3 greens and 4 tee complexes
- Golf Course Superintendent, Chris Reverie, won the Grassroots Ambassador Leadership Award presented by the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America



2020 GRANTS

- \$1.0 million – PennDOT/TASA – Jordan Creek Greenway Trail construction
- \$500,000 – DCNR – Jordan Creek Greenway Trail construction
- \$250,000 – DCNR – Valania Park construction
- \$130,000 – NRPA/Niagara Bottling – Valania Park construction
