Authorizes Grant Application to the PennDOT for Eight Hundred Thirty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty (\$830,750) to support the 15<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Lighting Project and Extension.

***Resolved by the Council of the City of Allentown, That***

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City of Allentown, Lehigh County hereby requests a Multimodal Transportation Fund Grant in the amount of \$830,750 from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation to fund improvements to the lighting on the 15<sup>th</sup> Street corridor and extend the system to Highland Street.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the City of Allentown hereby designates Ray O'Connell, Mayor, and Jessica Baraket, Purchasing Agent, as the official(s) to execute all documents and agreements between the City of Allentown and the Department of Transportation to facilitate and assist in obtaining the requested grant.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Council of the City of Allentown, hereby authorizes the City of Allentown to submit the application for Eight Hundred Thirty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$830,750) in Multimodal Transportation Funds to the Department of Transportation.

The City is submitting an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation requesting a grant of \$830,7500 in Multimodal Transportation Funds. This grant will fund the 15th Street Corridor-Traffic Signals and Systems Extension.
