WHEREAS, the City of Allentown is desirous of obtaining a HUD 108 for The Da Vinci Science Center for future development in the amount of Five Million Six Hundred Five Thousand (\$5,605,000) Dollars.

WHEREAS, the project is being undertaken by the DaVinci Science Center, an established 501(c)(3) not-for-profit entity that has been delivering educational programs through the Lehigh Valley for more than 20 years.

WHEREAS, the HUD 108 loan fund will flow from the City of Allentown to the Da Vinci Science Center as a pass-through loan and will be repaid by the Da Vinci Science Center in accordance with the repayment plan submitted at time of application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the appropriate officer of the City of Allentown is directed to execute a certificate attesting to the adoption of this Resolution and to furnish a copy of this Resolution to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The HUD standard for a Section 108 loan guarantee using this particular standard requires a minimum of one LMI person served per \$1,000 of the loan or 5,000 persons in the aggregate for a loan in the amount of \$5 million.
