Recommends Vaccinations and Masking as a Means of Adding Social and Economic Value to our Community

## Resolved by the Council of the City of Allentown, That

**WHEREAS**, the CDCs national ensemble predicts that the number of new daily confirmed COVID-19 hospital admissions will likely increase over the next 4 weeks, and

**WHEREAS**, much of the south is nearing a breaking point in their hospitals because of people not being vaccinated and not wearing masks; and

**WHEREAS**, to paraphrase an editorial in the NYT, rejecting a shot or refusing to wear masks is not a personal choice, such behavior increases our risk of catching a potentially deadly and disabling disease and perpetuates economic and social costs to our community including putting at risk our youth, in effect denying them an effective education – depriving us of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Allentown's Health Bureau, noting the number of hospitalizations among the unvaccinated, strongly recommends people consider vaccination; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Allentown's Health Bureau encourages citizens to mask when having close contact indoors with others outside your family or any time you are within 6 feet of others for a prolonged period; and

**WHEREAS**, recent polling suggests the public strongly supports mask mandates and an overwhelming majority opposed attempts to prevent local school districts from protecting children; and

**WHEREAS**, the FDA has given its full approval of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for 16 and over, calling it a "key achievement for public health

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT ALLENTOWN CITY COUNCIL** hereby asks others to step up to the plate and do their job in supporting our community by:

- 1. Getting the vaccination and masking up.
- 2. Recommending businesses and local governments consider vaccinations as a requirement of work.
- 3. Encouraging all businesses to require proof of vaccination to enter.
- 4. Examine establishing an insurance premium or no sick day policy for non-vaccinated individuals.
