AN ORDINANCE

An Ordinance providing for the expenditure of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars in Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG)- COVID CARES funds for the period of April 21, 2021 to April 20, 2022 and the establishment of appropriate accounts. The monies are received by the City of Allentown under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1976, as amended; The Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of 2009; and Title II of the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended; for the purpose of undertaking programs of housing and community development within the City.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLENTOWN:

SECTION ONE: That the Mayor is authorized to expend One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars in Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG)-COVID CARES funds for the period of April 21, 2021 to April 20, 2022, as appropriate by Federal Law and United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations.

SECTION TWO: That the Mayor is directed to establish and maintain any and all accounts and records as are necessary and to make such transfers as may be required to expend and account for said ESG-CV Funds in accordance with the approved Consolidated Plan, appropriate Federal law, and HUD regulations.

SECTION THREE: That this act of the Council of the City of Allentown is undertaken pursuant to Act 292 of 1976 in accordance with the opinion of the Pennsylvania Attorney General (Opinion 72-76) which holds that CDBG, HOME, and ESG Funds are General Municipal Funds for the purpose of Act 292 of 1976.

SECTION FOUR: That, in accordance with the contract, the Council of the City of Allentown authorizes the appropriation of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) in the following manner: <u>EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANTS - CV</u>
