Remote Participation of Councilmembers, City Staff and our Citizens: While the Council and City Hall doors are physically closed to the public, the Council Chambers are open to the public through electronic means. A Courtesy of the Floor section will be created for items not on the agenda. Please forward these requests to the City Clerk's email address above.

Live Comments During the Meeting: Email - Council will be taking live comments during the meeting following the regular protocols using email. Amending the 2020 Capital Fund Budget by transferring Thirty-Eight Thousand (\$38,000) Dollars from Capital Project 2024 – 15th Street Traffic Signal Improvement Project to Capital Project 1225 – Traffic Signal Upgrade Various - to fund the completion of the intersection upgrades at Emaus Avenue and Church Street, the original budgeted amount was insufficient. The completion of this intersection upgrade will provide a safer crossing at South Mountain Middle School.

Mr. Ed Zucal asked if there were any comments or questions from his committee or his colleagues. He asked Mr. Messinger to explain this Bill.

Mr. Craig Messinger stated that this a project that was originally started in 2016 budget for. It is an improvement that is done to the intersection by Church and Emmaus Avenue by South Mountain Middle School. The project started off to be a safety enhancement project, replacing the traffic signal poles, the crosswalks, handicap ramps, and as the project was being designed PennDot changed the standards for the foundations for the mast on holds. At that point in time, he took a little longer to get on board with PennDot on how they were going to design that. They got the design done. With that said they had issues with the corner properties. They did not want to sign off for the work to be done there. The property-owner at that place at all four corners had to actually go ahead and sign off that they would not change their egress or ingress to their property. Once everything was signed off, they finalized the permit with PennDot. You can see it was a long process to get to this point. It was an increase because they had to have larger foundations and larger poles. The project has been going on so long the prices have increased a little bit. However, they do have funds that are left over from the Project on 15th Street with the State Project there. They had funding to transfer for it. It is a project that they need to complete. It is very vital for the school and for the safety of the people going in and out of that location. We do have the funding for it, but it was because of the changes to PennDot regulations for the foundations, the mast on poles and how long it took. It is why they need the transfer for it.

Mr. Ed Zucal stated it is understandable and asked if there were any questions from the public.

A motion was made by Joshua Siegel, seconded by Candida Affa, that this Bill be forwarded favorably to Council for approval. The motion carried by the following vote:
