This bill originates from the Department of Parks and Recreation

- Summary and facts of the bill.

The City of Allentown is submitting a formal application to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) for \$1,000,000 awarded from the Statewide Local Share Account (LSA) grant that will support the construction of a new park operations facility located in the Lehigh Parkway. The LSA funding will be utilized to construct a new building.

 - a. What are the specific goals or tasks the bill seeks to accomplish?

The Resolution is a requirement of the application to demonstrate the City's support for the project and to designate Mayor Matthew Tuerk as the signatory of the contract with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The benefits are this project will create a modern, safe, and ADA-compliant facility that consolidates all divisions. Expected measurable outcomes include: construction of one new operations facility; consolidation of two outdated buildings into one efficient site; retention of all existing parks, maintenance, recreation, and events staff; creation of temporary construction jobs; reduction in travel time between departments; improved staff meeting efficiency; and increased operational productivity. Upon completion, all staff, equipment, and materials will transition into the new building, resulting in a unified, safe, and fully compliant operations center that supports long-term community service.

- c. How does this bill relate to the City's vision/mission/priorities?

This grant aligns with a safer, cleaner, healthier Allentown as it will allow for a cleaner and healthier modern facility to support parks and recreation.
